


GIRL SCOUTS PRESENT PORT FLAG



The sunny future for the Port of Anchorage predicted by seweral speakers at its official dedication this morning began with a cloudy day.

The dedication, including flag raising ceremonies and the unveiling of a dedicatory plague, centered on the theme

There were also cautioning statements, saying that everyone will have to work together, to really put the Port of Anchorage into business. But for the most part the new \$8,200,000 project was praised as a step in the right direction for future growth of this

A two-day open house at the new terminal began with the dedication. The public may tour the facilities from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. today and Sunday. A few port officials plan to be present during those times to discuss the port.

The Coast Guard Cutter "Sedge" will be tied up at the dock and will be open for inspection following the ceremony and again tomorrow from 1 p.m. to 4 p.m.
