The Port of Anchorage will pay \$186,000 in interest on its \$6.2 million in construction bonding Feb. 15.

Don Walter, port's business manager, said more than sufficient money to cover the payment was on deposit in the port's trustee account Jan. 31.

Payments are due Feb. 15 and Aug. 15 of each year. The February payment is interest only; the August payment represents interest and principal.

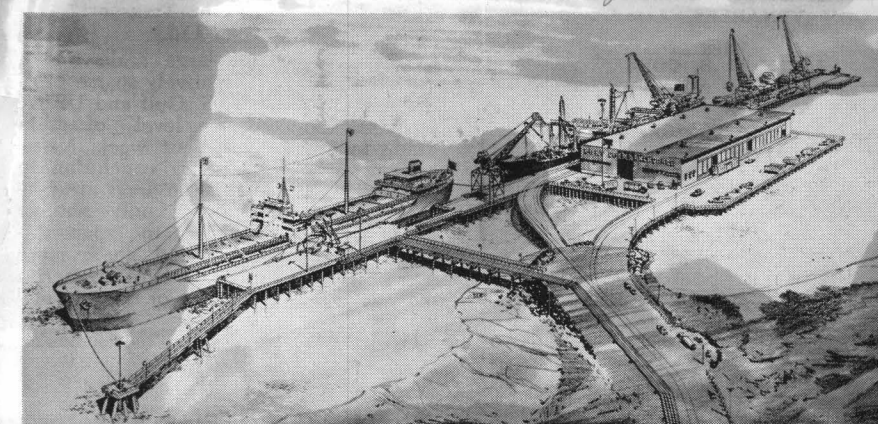
Area Democratic Club Supports Port Bond Issue

The Greater Anchorage Democratic Club went on record this week supporting the two bond issues for the Port of Anchorage which will be submitted to city voters March 9.

A resolution urging support of the bond issues totaling \$2.5 million was passed unanimously by the club after a talk by Port Director A. E. Harned on the port development plans.

The club at the same time voted to appoint a special committee to assist in pushing passage of the bond issues.

The possibility of supporting the port bond issues with radio and television programs will come before the club at its monthly business meeting at 8 p.m. Tuesday at the Democratic headquarters, 318 Sixth Ave., according to president John Roderick.

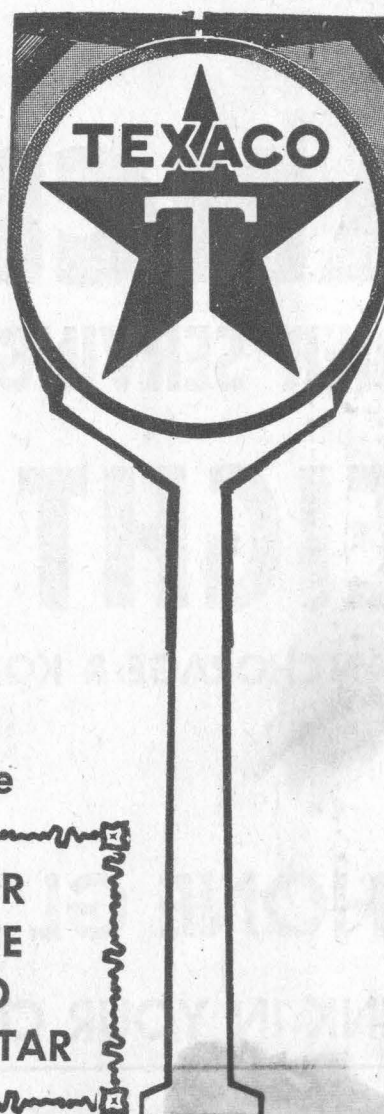
