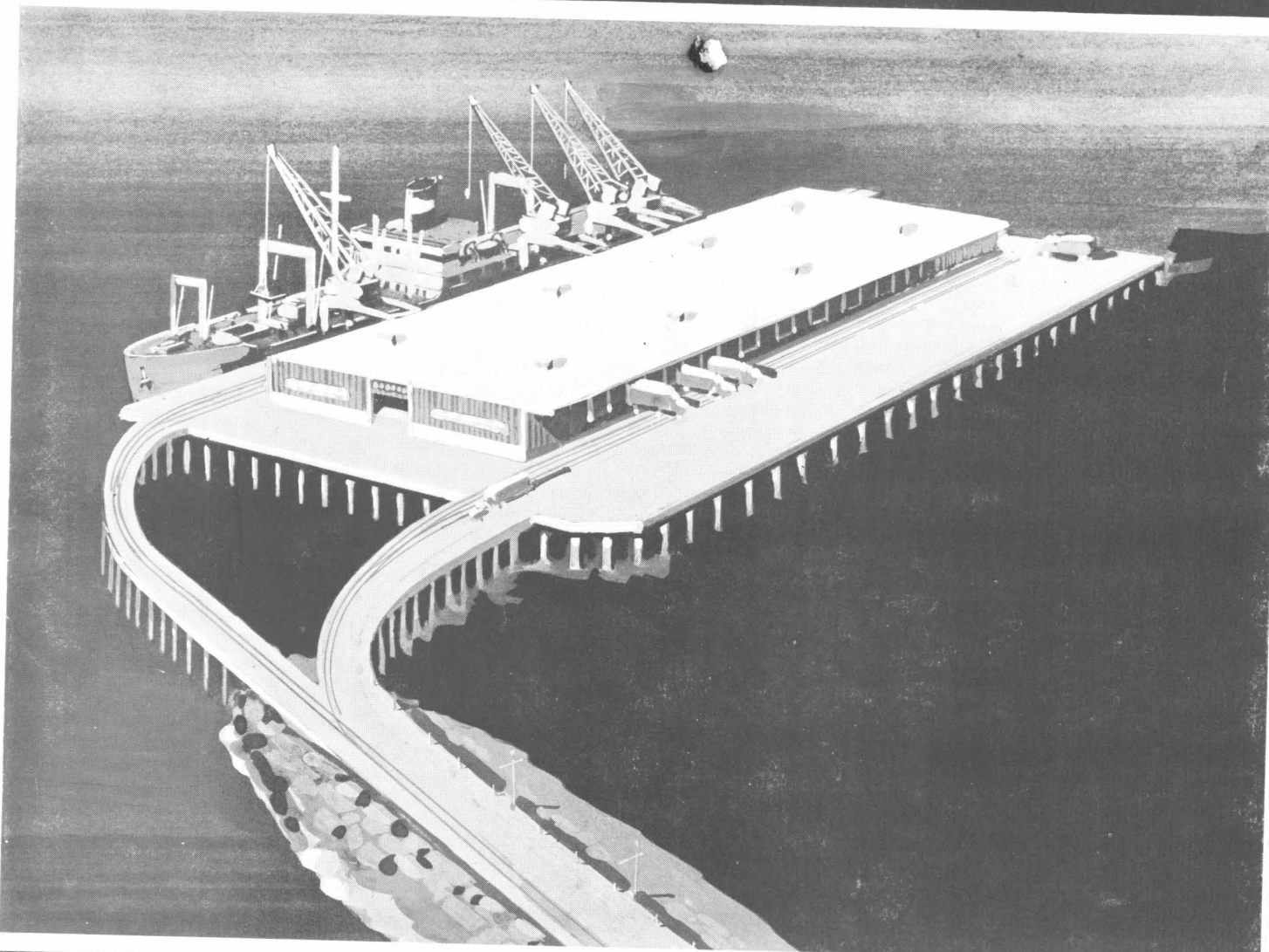
### SEA-LAND TO BEEF UP RUN TO ALASKA PORTS

SEATTLE — Sea-Land Service Inc. has scheduled two converted C-4 troopships with a greater carrying capacity than the Seattle and Anchorage for the Seattle-Anchorage-Kodiak container run.

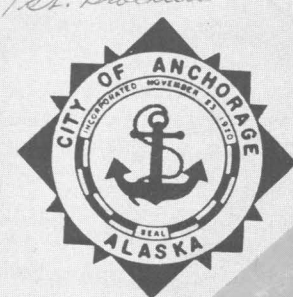
The replacement ships will carry 380 of Sea-Land's jumbo 35 foot vans as compared with 300 vans on the two ships now handling the run. The suspension of Alaska Steamship's weekly van run from Seattle to Seward is believed responsible for the move.

The two ships now on the run, the largest in regular berth service to Alaska, have been active since the service began in 1964. They will be shifted to another service when the bigger ships arrive. No date was set but it is expected to be in the near future.
