

You and your family are invited to the Port of Anchorage open house for Muni employees on Sunday, Sept. 25, 2016

The Port is a Muni department that benefits the entire state of Alaska. It handles more than four million tons of fuel and cargo annually that reaches 85 percent of all Alaskans. It opened in 1961 and was the only deep-water dock in Southcentral Alaska that survived the 1964 Good Friday Earthquake and tsunamis. The Port supports virtually every aspect of our state's economy, from big oil and military bases . . . to your favorite grocery store, gas station and ice cream cart.

Department of Homeland Security rules prevent most Alaskans from visiting the Port. But you and your family can take an hour-long tour between 11 am-4 pm to see the Port up close and watch ships unload.



Motor coach tours will depart every 30 minutes starting at 11 am from the Alaska Railroad parking lot on West Ship Creek Avenue, across from Comfort Inn Downtown—Ship Creek (111 W Ship Creek Avenue). Enjoy a bus tour of the Port's shore-side facilities and a roof-top, BBQ lunch on the dock while two container ships unload. The last tour departs at 3:30 pm and will return to the parking lot by 4:30 pm.

badge for you and your family to board the bus. All adults and children 16-or-older must show a driver's license or other government-issued photo identification. DHS rules prohibit civilian firearms on Port property.
